#### JACOB ZARMESKI 2nd Place - 14.27 lbs. & 5.20 lb. Lunker

**Mark Harold** returned to his winning ways by outpacing the field of 29 anglers by almost 6 pounds. Mark caught 12 fish on the day and weighed in a stringer of smallmouth weighing 20.15 lbs.

Mark said, "After weighing in 18.72 pounds and finishing second in the opening tournament held on Saturday, I made the decision that on Sunday I would not go to my security blanket largemouths like I did on Saturday. The plan was to spend the whole day fishing for the less abundant but bigger smallmouths. If I couldn't catch five smallmouths and bombed I was okay with that, I was going for the win.

Instead of writing again about what is now known as "The Secret Lure", you can go to my Day One (June 24) report to read about this moving bait.

On Saturday, I had arrived at my smallmouth area after 8 o'clock with about a ten pound limit of largemouths in the livewell. Today, with an empty livewell, I rolled into the area with only hope and anticipation of a day full of giant smallies willing to eat the secret lure. It didn't take long for that hope and anticipation to become a reality.

In short order, smallmouth were going into the livewell. At one point an almost five pounder was added to the well and on the very next cast another close to five pounds joined her. When I caught my limit fish it was a little before 8 o'clock and the five totaled over 19 pounds. Those security blanket largemouth that I decided not to visit today were a distant memory, as I had over 19 pounds before the time I had started targeting smallmouth the day before.

I caught 11 smallmouths and one largemouth on the day as I culled my way up to five smallmouth weighing 20.15 pounds.

Not so surprisingly, my partner *Jake Zaremski* accepted when I offered him one of my secret lures. He used the lure to quickly add three fish to the two he already had, the last being a 5.20 pound smallmouth. That big fish was the biggest caught by anyone during the two tournament days. Jake, who is a new Rochester Bassmasters member, weighed in 14.27 pounds to place second in the tourney. Congratulations Jake!!!"

Rookie *Jake Zaremski* brought in a limit of 14.27 lbs. to take 2<sup>nd</sup> place. Jake also had lunker on the day, a 5.20 lb. smallmouth.

Jake said, "I spent fishing in 6-10 FOW around large grass patches looking for holes in the grass. My first fish came on a drop shot on a Dobyns Savvy Series Micro Guide rod paired with an Ardent Finesse 2000 reel spooled with 10 lb. Sunline SX1 braid with a 7 lb. Sunline Super FC Sniper leader. My second fish came on a white popper while the wind laid down for about 20 minutes. My other three fish, including my largest, 5.2 pound smallmouth, came around the same large grass patches with wind blowing hard on the same rod and reel setup as my drop shot. Both days my boaters put me on good schools of fish. Day 1, I had the bites for a good bag but I missed opportunities, and day 2 I boated all the bites I had. "

**Dave Livingston** weighed in a five fish 14.17 lb. limit for 3<sup>rd</sup> place.

*Kurt Keller* caught five fish on the day and brought in 13.99 lbs. for 4<sup>th</sup> place.

Kurt said, "The bite started slow for *Aidan Blake* & me but once the wind picked up so did the bite. I caught good fish both days of practice on a couple different, moving baits but I could not get that bite going Sunday. Aiden got us on a worm rig that was producing in the 3-4 foot waves.

We drifted countless times until we found an area approximately 50 yards square that was loaded with BIG fish. We struggled to get all the fish in the boat fighting the fish/ waves/nerves. Thank you to Aidan for a great day on the water and a special thank you to *Mark Harold* who tolerated us fishing in the same general area all weekend and even offered suggestions other than a new location to fish. Mark is a true LEGEND! I'm sponsored by my wife who supports my fishing weekend adventures. My winnings will go toward a drift sock!"

2015 Angler of the Year, *Tom Haley* brought in 12.91 lbs. for  $5^{th}$  place.

Tom said, "I failed to find a reliable smallmouth pattern in practice on Thursday or Friday so I reluctantly decided to target largemouth, at least until I had a limit. Todd Keller and I spent about a half day targeting largemouth in practice just in case I failed to find smallmouth. Though most fish where caught pitching soft plastics in practice later in the day, I thought the area looked perfect for a popping frog. Started out on Saturday with a good bite and had a 12.5 lb limit by 6:30 and my final 13.37lb bag by 9:00. Spent the rest of the day trying to find big smallmouth but like practice, I failed to find them or upgrade my bag. I was pretty disappointed that I still couldn't figure out the smallmouth but was surprised I wasn't the only one come weigh-in time. Caught approximately 15-20 keeper largemouth and 2 smallmouth on day 1. Bulk of fish caught Spro popping frog or beaver (3/4 ounce) on 40-50lb Seaguar Smackdown braid.

Day 2 arrived and **Todd Keller** was supportive of targeting largemouth all day. We arrived at my day one starting spot at within a few minutes I had my first blow up on the frog. Immediately I knew that the bite wasn't going to be as easy as Saturday. A few more fish swirled at the frog before I finally caught one. Worked the area pretty



BILL WITTMAN 6th Place - 12.84 lbs. hard and decided it was time to move to our second spot. Almost immediately I caught keepers on back to back casts on a senko. Fish were holding on shoals. Todd and I proceeded to catch 10-15 fish in the next hour. I'd catch 2 small keepers and Todd would catch a 2-2.5 pound fish. Action slowed but we still caught fish through the day on senkos and pitching soft plastics in 4-7 feet of water. Heavy winds made pitching a challenge but once the fish adapted to the weather change we were still able to get a consistent bite. Between the two of us I would estimate we caught 20-25 keepers, all largemouth. One nice pike had me a little excited as he had me buried in the weeds. We sailed by him at about 10 knots before I got the talon down, still hoping it was a really big bass, but by then he was behind the boat. Though I wasn't happy it was a pike, I'm glad he didn't' get away with me thinking it could have been a huge bass. Had a good time spending two days fishing with Todd.

Wasn't hopeful going into this tournament, so I was glad to make it out with a 5th and 6th place finish. I didn't hit anything and survived Kurt Keller's attempt to poison me with year old rotten hotdogs. Also, I think *Tige Noni* and *Chris Burns* need to create their own version of the "Larry the Legend" videos based on *Mark "The Legend" Harold*. Of course Mark the Legend would be wearing a speedo while sporting the 70's Afro. YouTube Bass Fishing with Larry the Legend if you are not a current fan of Hunter's videos."

**Bill Wittman** weighed in 12.84 lbs. for a  $6^{th}$  place finish.

Weighing 12.76 lbs. to round out the top seven was *Bob Manley*.

Bob said, "Well we have another tournament destination out of the way. It was an interesting one in many ways. Off the water, I was reminded of the fun that can be had, hanging out at the motel, shooting the breeze, talking about fishing and other things. There was some imbibing done too.

I also learned a lot over the weekend. Both on the water and off the water. Unfortunately most of what I learned was off the water. One of the things that I didn't learn was any of **Tom Haley's** way points. I guess he doesn't imbibe as much as the

On Saturday, after not having much luck fishing open water weed beds, I apologized to my non-boater, **Dalton Forte**. He asked why I was apologizing, feeling terrible I told him that I was about to back boat him. I had found fish hanging on the edge of the reeds. The pattern worked well. I hoped it would work as well on Sunday. It did.

On Sunday, I lost about an hour of fishing time. While idling out to the river for blast off, Paul Caldwell noticed that there wasn't any water spitting out of the back of my motor. Eventually the problem was solved and it was time to get going. I idled out through the narrows. Did I mention that there was a 5mph speed limit? The fish were hanging under the mats. I caught all my fish by flipping a blue rage tail to the reeds. I boated over 20 keepers throughout the day. Unfortunately they were all cookie cutters.

Later in the day the wind kicked up and I knew that it wasn't going to be a fun ride back. Did I mention that there was a 5 mph speed limit within 600 ft. from shore? It's not often I can say this, but I was right it wasn't fun.
